3. Schamberg, M L - PHOTOGRAPHY PORTFOLIO.

Studio photo album of signed portraits.

[Philadelphia]: 1916. Unique. Large 4to. There are seven 6 x 9 inch photographic portraits of a family - <u>all signed by</u> Schamberg.

Morton Livingston Schamberg (1881-1918) was one of a small group of avant garde American artists at the turn of the twentieth century who were major contributors to the American modernist movement. Two retrospective exhibitions at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts in 1963 and a traveling museum show in 1982-`3 serve as the public re-discovery of his work and the recognition of his central role in what has come to be called the 'Precisionist' movement. Though a painter he worked and supported himself as a portrait photographer from about 1912 until his death in 1918 (note the 2007 sale of his abstract photograph 'God' at Christies for \$390,000.). Little of his photographic work has come to market. This is no doubt in part because of his untimely early death in the 1918 flu pandemic. The portraits offered here are a single family of mother and children. Each is tipped on to a sheet of white watercolor paper and bears Schamberg's pencil signature. The work is bound in black paper wrappers with Schamberg's studio blind stamp and a mtd. piece of gold leaf in the center of the front cover providing an decorative embellishment. The binding was probably created in Schamberg's studio. See the catalog with text by William Agee : M L Schamberg, 1982.

An excellent run of the engineering reports for the improvement of Baltimore Harbor and the Patapsco River in the late nineteenth century. Work on this project was intermittent because of the lack of federal funding. The text provides a vivid account of the work of the Army Corps of Engineers (as well as a mind numbing level of detail) throughout the last decades of the nineteenth century. There is an occasional text map in the body of the reports. The editorial changes and alteration of tables and report information noted throughout are extensive. This copy was the personal property of A H Hutton, engineer and member of the Baltimore Harbor Board. He has signed it on the first leaf of text. \$425

A rare and exceptional copy of a key book in post war economic theory and one of lasting impact on the American economy. This is the first time the full text of the Nobel Prize winner's legendary graduate course on price theory at the University of Chicago was published. As Friedman states in the preface to the text: "I have been extremely reluctant to have these notes offered for general sale. The reluctance has derived from my dissatisfaction with their scrappy nature. ... I went over the summaries, revised them in detail, wrote alternative versions for some, substituted previously written but

unpublished material for others, and inserted, both then and at intervals since, published material that seemed particularly relevant. ... I have added to this version of the notes, two appendices ... which may help to supplement the notes." The work on price, and consumption offered here is the core of his economic work. The book finally appeared in 1976. See New Palgrave II, 422 - 427 for the entry on Friedman. \$7,800

Whitcomb was a member of the Guitar and Mandolin Club, and Drama Club as well as

being an organist. He participated in the Minstrel Show of 1899 (program present) and the Webster Centennial there is a copy of the banquet menu. In all an elaborate well preserved memorial to Ivy League college days at the turn of the twentieth century. \$800

Major Girard provided expert testimony in relation to the deadly or severe wounding effect of what he considered to be small caliber weapons at long ranges (in excess of 1000 yards). The weapons were anything but "small" caliber by modern standards. But given that the study of the laws that govern the effect of shot on anim"l tis"ue were relatively new at this time Girard offers a great deal that is important. \$300

Unique: ca1919. Oblong folio commercial album. The album contains appx. 180 black & white photographic prints in four distinct size categories: 110 x 165mm.; 100 x 137 mm.; 48 x 60mm.; 80 x 55 mm. Most are of the size of a photographic postcard and are printed on Azo paper. Azo was a silver chloride photographic printing paper that was manufactured by Eastman Kodak in one name or another beginning in 1898. It is a contact printed paper that is extremely slow and does not exhibit the degradation issues that a silver bromide printing paper experiences. It lasts indefinitely with the result that the photographs in this album are "fresh" looking. The List offered here is mimeographed (recto & verso), 45 pp., in a small folio format. It contains concise descriptions of the contents of each photograph being offered. Good; 6 album leaves are separated from the binding with chipping to the extremities.

A superb album with some unusual contents. There is a series of 6 photographs (one in color utilizing "split-tone" coloring technique) of an early female Russian aeronaut

and several aerial photographs of ground installations. The troops arrived at Vladivostok by way of the East Indies and what appears to be China because there are also a series of about 35 photographs dealing with natives and villages (unidentified). The majority, however, are devoted to Siberia and wintering over. Japanese troops are shown standing guard or encamped, artillery installation etc. A handful of the photographs were selected from the Signal Corps List provided here with the album (identified by a number code on the lower right). Most of the remaining photographs are briefly identified as to place or subject. A fascinating record. See Slater, A Nasty Little War, who bases a good deal of her narrative on the photographs and diaries of those involved. \$1,800



Artist Allyn Cox created murals in the U.S. Capitol over two decades from 1952 to 1972. He completed and restored the last 32 feet of the Frieze of American History (a painted



panorama depicting significant events in American history) and restored the Apotheosis of Washington in the Rotunda. He also designed murals for three first-floor corridors in the House wing, now called the Cox Corridors, and completed two of them before his death. In 1952 Cox was selected to finish the "Frieze of American History" in the Capitol Rotunda begun in 1878 by Constantino Brumidi and continued by Filippo Costaggini after Brumidi's death. He designed and painted three scenes that filled a gap that had existed

since 1889. He also restored the original portion of the frieze, and in 1959 he restored Brumidi's "Apotheosis of George Washington" in the eye of the Dome by repainting it. \$1,800

Hermann Rosse studied at the Academy of Art in The Hague and trained in architecture and design at the Delft Polytechnic School and the South Kensington College of Art in London. From 1908 to 1910 he attended Stanford University in California, earned his B.A. in architecture, and designed several residences. From 1911 to 1913 he produced most of the decorative interior designs — including paintings, stained glass, tiles, and marquetry —



for the Peace Palace at The Hague. He moved to Palo Alto. California, where he was commissioned to design decorations for the Netherlands pavilion at the 1915 Panama-Pacific International Exposition in San Francisco. In 1914 he became an exhibiting member of the exclusive San Francisco Sketch Club. He moved to Illinois in 1918. There he accepted an appointment to head the Design Department of the school at the Art Institute of Chicago. In addition to teaching, he took private commissions for interiors. fabric designs and book

illustrations, and created sets for the stage in conjunction with Ben Hecht, Kenneth Macgowan, the Goodman Theater, and Mary Garden's Chicago Grand Opera Company. In April 1919 his work was included in the highly popular, Exhibition of American Stage Designs, at the Bourgeois Galleries in New York City, along with contributions by Macgowan, James Blanding Sloan, Robert Edmond Jones, Norman Bel Geddes, Joseph Urban, and many others. In 1923 Rosse moved with his


family to New City in Rockland County, New York. He created the sets for the Ziegfeld Follies (1922), Casanova and The Swan (1923), Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue (1926), He was at the peak of his career in the '20s. The Arden Gallery presented 80 of his original works in this show. The Chapin Library houses the Rosse archive - apparently missing this catalog. See Lieberman, Art of the Twenties, for the Arden Gallery show of French art (Derain, Picasso, Matisse, Braque) in 1919. \$525

A sentimental assemblage of varied material related to the birth and childhood of a daughter for this upper middle class family. The notebook is blank with the exception of an inserted, colored, calligraphic title that signals the intention. Instead the book has acted as a "receiver" for inserted memorabilia relating to the child



and the family. Summers on the Cape, a visit to the children's matinee where the Mad Tea Party from Alice in Wonderland was presented (Dec., 1909) - docketed by mother who recorded it as the baby's first outing - to the charming, well executed, watercolor seating cards for Thanksgiving (partial contents list). The family once resided in Short Hills, NJ. \$350

Gennert, a German immigrant to the United States, lived most of his life (1854 - 1935) in New York City. He apparently spent time in Pennsylvania, given the references in this diary. It is an unusual compilation of a self aware, curious individual with political and artistic interests. He served as a drummer boy for the 96th New York Regiment during the Civil War (a mounted photograph in uniform in the diary is self identified) and

had a career as an electrical inventor who held several patents assigned to the Manhattan Brass Company and E P Gleason Manufacturing Co. The diary however, does not deal with his business accomplishments. It is focused on events, places, historical incidents, architecture, and people he knew. It is retrospective and apparently accomplished in the last decade of his life. Gennert lived through one of the most transformative periods in American history, including WWI and then the stock market crash of 1929. The overall tone of the diary is patriotic and suffuses the entries throughout. Despite this he could also be quite acid in his observations on society or the actions of those around him or in political life. There are several illustrated scenes of what could only have been childhood reminiscences of Pennsylvania country life that are unlikely to be recorded elsewhere. A remarkable, illustrated, record of a life. \$5.800

The 8 leaves with furnishings etc. (and the title page) have a line of perforations parallel to the gutter to facilitate their removal; some of the perforations are starting.

Very good; rebacked in maroon cloth; modest soiling to the covers; title page loose - perforations separated. Original printed glazed boards.

The end of the line for a tradition that Martin Engelbrecht's publishing firm was associated with in the mid-eighteenth century. Known by the appellation of "Klebealbum" - a vogue in the late eighteenth century in South Germany, particularly Augsburg, for creating scrapbooks depicting homes, their contents, and the family life therein by parents for the edification of their children - and often based on the printed illustrations churned out by Engelbrecht's workshop along with others (e.g., H Vleck in Amsterdam, Renner in Nürnberg, Iversen in Copenhagen) into the nineteenth century (Stetten, Geschichte ..., 1779, p. 398 refers to Engelbrecht and the fact that the, " ... illuminierten ... Aussschneidebilder sehr guten Abgang fanden."). The true Klebealbum was a scrapbook, assembled by a pre-adolescent child. The handful of examples that survive are usually organized as a "tour" through a residence where each room is decorated with applied illustrations (hence the name). The commercial exploitation of the idea (offered here) is the end of any original thought that underlay the creation of such records.

All of the original decorative pieces are still in their color printed punch-out forms. The background room settings in the Williams' book offered here follow a typical Arts & Crafts styling popular at the time. 

Very good with one abraded (chipped?), circular, gap (on the necklace of the primary figure) in the painted image that measures appx. 3/16 of an inch in diameter. The gap is on the verso of the screen. The screen mesh is in good condition, i.e., <u>not</u> punctured.

As found.

A most unusual representation of New Deal ideals within the genre of Baltimore screen painting. This manner of folk-art is singular to Baltimore and started some time around WWI. The "painting" offered here is actually some form of lithography (we have seen an identical image as part of a set with the same framing) and deviates



dramatically from the typical subjects - country scenes or lifeless landscapes - of the genre. The artist is unknown but one assumes must have been a beneficiary of a WPA project somewhere at some time (based on the

prominent presence of the American "Federal" eagle on the lower right of the painting). This is one of a series of four whose subjects were "Truth", "Justice", "Liberty" and "Equality" that made up the set. They were most likely meant as wall decoration for a public building (court house?). It is remarkable that the medium of wire mesh screening was used to produce the image - perhaps a Baltimore artist reverting to his/her roots in the WPA program. The result is a graphic "icon" made inexpensively yet more lasting than a depiction on paper and employing more hands in its production. \$1,500

to the cloth and the Briggs updated version whereby a design is traced with a stylus (utilizing the purchased pattern) with an underlay of colored waxed paper (purchased) thus transferring the pattern to the cloth. This trade catalog acts as a design inventory supplied from the firm. The format and printing of this catalog suggest a limited distribution to retailers. 

In July 1923, U.S. Army Air Service announced that it intended to attempt a global flight the following year. Four specially built aircraft were commissioned from the Douglas Aircraft Company. The World Cruisers, as they were called, were christened the Seattle, the Chicago, the Boston, and the New Orleans. Only the New Orleans and the Chicago completed the arduous 44,085 km (27,553 mi) flight. It took 175 days, with a flying time of 371 hours 11 minutes. Throughout the journey the crews

prevailed against an endless series of forced landings, repairs, bad weather, and other mishaps. There is a fabric sample taken from the aircraft prior to restoration affixed to the printed commemorative document issued by the National Air and Space Museum of the Smithsonian. \$400

An early, remarkable set of views illustrating aspects of the territories, commerce, and culture. Some of the places illustrated are Ketchikan, Treadwell, and Juneau and what appears to be the Yukon River and settlements. The Alaskan gold mining firm (ATGM Co.) was incorporated in 1890 based on Douglas Island in the Gastineau Channel across from Juneau - they are all photographed. Other discoveries are certain, e.g., the Poodledog Cafe shows up, Yukon stern wheeler, Royal Alexander Hotel (not the one in Winnipeg). The presence of internal evidence - names, geographic peculiarities, buildings - in the photographs will lead to the identification and location of most scenes. The technical aspects of the photographs is explained in Lavédrine / Gandolfo's book The Lumière Autochrome, History, Technology (see pp. 30-33). It was around this time that numerous technical advances in color photography were introduced (notably flexible film support, evident in these examples, for emulsions to replace the ubiqitous glass plate). The leader in the field were the Lumière Bros. in France. Efforts by Kodak were dependent on sub-contracted work carried out in California by Technicolor. It was not until much later that Kodak succeeded in introducing the color negative to produce \$8.500 color prints. A unique set.

As an economic advisor to President Reagan Laffer had a ready audience for his ideas and what followed in train "as only logical". The result being a tax system in America that is skewed to benefit the upper income groups in society. Mr Baky was



a banker who no doubt met Laffer. Framed with a humorous political cartoon and explanation of the theory.





A year after the infamous Chicago Democratic convention of August 1968 the SDS planned a week long

event in Chicago. A "National Action" - street protests in Chicago against the continuing war in Vietnam. These protests marked the emergence of the Weathermen faction in the SDS. The document offered here was freely distributed in Chicago during that time. The October SDS National Council meeting in Boulder (Oct. 1968) had adapted the slogan: "The elections don't mean shit - Vote where the power is - Our power is in the street!". Few turned up, most were arrested. We brought the war to the streets.



51. Anon. – **New England dyer's notebook**.

Unique. ca1810. Commercial notebook of thick wove blank paper; meas. appx. 162 x 95 mm., bound in sixes; alphabetical tabbed index for the first ten leaves. This is followed by 27 leaves of dyeing recipes. A <u>number of recipes are accompanied by small mounted color samples</u>. The balance of the notebook is blank. It does contain records of several miscellaneous items with one transaction for Hallowell [Maine?] dated 1805. Though several names appear, no conclusive attribution of authorship was obtained. There are appx. 80 recipes noted.


Good; some stains and general signs of wear. Reverse hide envelope flap binding of the period.

A record of cloth dyeing ingredients and their combinations for affecting various colors. Both vegetable and pigment dyes are utilized. Generic names are used throughout, e.g., copperas (iron sulfate) used as a green coloring; fustic, based upon several plants



for a yellow; logwood, a standard throughout the 18th & 19th century for black; barwood (another standard and common name for African rosewood) used in differing concentrations for soft pinks to deep pinks and purples;

camwood, widely known as an "insoluble red" as a basis or red/bronze or deep pinks in various concentrations. The notes indicate an emphasis on "drab" (so identified), i.e., muted, colors. A novel feature of the notebook is the manner of record for the recipes. They appear to be given in proportions to weights of cloth. Dyeing 20 or 30 lbs. - indicated - of cloth, bespeaks a commercial operation. No commercial transactions are recorded. An interesting and early manuscript record. \$2,000



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
